### Day trip To Galway



Today you will have the Wild Atlantic Way to your side as we make our way to Galway City. 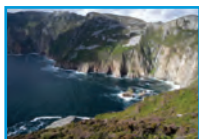

The restored Belvedere House is an 18th Century hunting/fishing lodge, designed by the renowned German architect Richard Castle for Robert Rochfort, later the First Earl of Belvedere. A fascinating walled garden, designed by Ninian Nevin in 1857, contains one of Ireland's finest collections of rare and special plants. The stable block is home to a modern visitor centre with fully licensed cafe. Enjoy an Irish themed Dinner & Pub quiz.

## DAY 3

### Day Trip into Dublin



Visit Ireland's capital city & explore the city at your leisure. Take in the sights on a Hop on Hop off tour, visit Temple Bar for a pint and browse through their vintage markets, go shopping on O'Connell Street and visit the famous Spire. 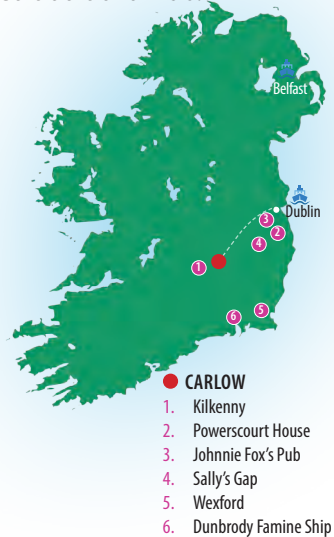

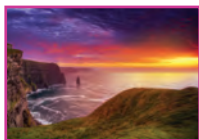

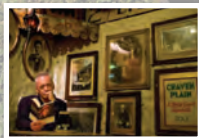
